#### 2. Rationale for the module and its links with other modules

In this unit, students will design and create a fancy-dress outfit for World Book Day using a commercial pattern, as well as adapting a pre-existing garment.

#### 3. Aims of the module

Each student will use a commercial pattern and be introduced to the terminology used and the relevant techniques required to create a garment based on their design. Students will also customise an existing garment to complete their fancy-dress outfit.

#### 6. Learning, teaching and assessment strategy for the module

Teacher-led PowerPoints containing instructions, images and videos will be discussed at the beginning of each session. Each week, students are guided through the techniques of using a commercial pattern. They are also reminded of embellishment techniques learned over the previous two years to enable them to realise their design. Assessment is formative throughout, and a summative assessment is carried out in week 7.

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### 7. Intended learning outcomes

At the end of the module, learners will be expected to:

- 1. Demonstrate and reflect on safe practice while using sewing tools and equipment and a sewing environment.
- 2. Design and create a fancy-dress costume for World Book Day.
- **3.** Follow a commercial pattern to construct a garment.
- **4.** Apply knowledge of fabric grain and accurately cut garment from fabric using the appropriate tools.
- 5. Apply sewing and embellishment techniques to create a design, incorporating a pre-existing garment.
- **6.** Use an iron to enhance a garment's finish.

## 8. Indicative content (this should provide an overview of content over the number of weeks of module delivery)

Students will create a fancy-dress outfit by using a commercial pattern to make a garment and will also customise an existing item of clothing to suit their theme using embellishment methods. Students will be encouraged to work independently to complete this project, drawing on all the skills and techniques learned during the course: use a commercial pattern to create a garment; adapt the pattern to suit the fancy-dress design; cut from fabric; embellish with techniques learned over the previous two years; and upcycle an existing garment to suit the theme. Students may also use this time to make any props, such as hats, wands, swords and masks.

Week 1: Identify and cut paper pattern

Week 2: Cut fabrics and begin embellishment

Week 3: Embellish garment including pre-existing garment

Weeks 4 and 5: Construct garment

Week 6: Finalise both garments, make any props

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Week 7: Summative assessment	
Week 8: Submission of reflection

Students will carry out the project over six weeks. During that time, the lecturers will be formatively assessing the work and giving constructive feedback. In week 7, we will be carrying out summative assessment of the work produced.
