In this Special Issue we welcome papers capturing aspects of wellbeing in the field of home-based educare, that includes 'homely' settings, contexts, programmes, practices in which children interact and grow up. We are seeking for the application of studies of wellbeing for home-based educarers, in the UK and around the globe, going beyond established discourses, to open an honest and challenging debate. A wide range of possible areas of focus could consider ethics, policy and funding of childcare, parenting and family studies, play, equity and rights, sustainability, population mobility, community and cultural cohesion.

To this end, we have an open ongoing call for papers on child and family wellbeing. Papers may be theoretical/conceptual, empirical research, systematic literature reviews or scoping studies, methodological, critical reviews or commentaries, research digests.
