Building on learning from modules NC5206: Supporting Children to Regulate Behaviour, NC6201: Developing Your Nanny Philosophy and NC6205: Embedding Self-Regulation into Practice through Play, this module will provide an opportunity for students to explore how theory can be applied to their professional skills in understanding and supporting families in challenging times.
